Preferred applicants would have an undergraduate or advanced degree in mathematics, science, technology or engineering. We especially welcome applicants who have completed (or who are in the process of completing) Waldorf Teacher Training. Applicants must be committed to collaborative work with colleagues and families, as well as to working in an environment that fosters the education of the whole human being. This position primarily includes teaching upper level topics in mathematics, as well as topics in earth sciences and/or life sciences. Additional responsibilities include chaperoning student trips, various in-school supervisions, and possibly coaching or offering other after-school activities.
